ASSISTANT PROFESSOR – COUNSELING

The Department of Education, Counseling, and Leadership in the College of Education and Health Sciences invites applications for a tenure-track position at the rank of assistant professor of counseling. Responsibilities include, but are not limited to: teaching graduate counseling courses in the campus-based and online CACREP-approved Master of Arts in Counseling program, as well as engagement in scholarship and service. The position requires an earned Ph.D. or Ed.D. in Counselor Education from a CACREP-approved program. The starting date for the position is August 2020.

The Department is seeking applicants to teach core and specialty courses in the clinical mental health and professional school counseling tracks for both the online and on-campus programs. In addition to teaching, responsibilities of the position include, but are not limited to: scholarly productivity; advising students and participating in prospective student interviews; service-related activities to include participating in department and college meetings and committees, as well as in the profession; and fulfilling other departmental duties and responsibilities as assigned.

Qualifications include a Ph.D. or Ed.D. in counselor education or related discipline, experience teaching graduate counseling courses; evidence of applied practice in counseling; experience supervising master's level students in counseling, and eligible for licensure in the State of Illinois. Neurocounseling and online teaching experience is desired. Visa sponsorship is available for this position.

To apply, candidates must submit a letter of application, curriculum vitae, copies of credentials (certification, license), evidence of successful teaching, and contact information for three professional references (name, phone number, and email address).
