



Assistant/Associate Professor in Counseling Department Of Counseling, Health & Kinesiology Texas A&M University - San Antonio



The Department of Counseling, Health, and Kinesiology seeks applicants for a full-time, Assistant or Associate Professor of Counseling. Rank will be determined based on qualifications and experience. Currently, Texas A&M University-San Antonio is experiencing enormous growth and is in the process of developing a new 700 acre campus located on the Southside of San Antonio. The Counseling program is a robust program with an active faculty devoted to teaching, service, scholarship, and professional development. The successful candidate will teach graduate classes in the Counseling Program (i.e., Clinical Mental Health, School, and Marriage Couple and Family Counseling); maintain an active research agenda; supervise practicum and internship students; and fulfill service responsibilities to the Department and the University. Candidates will also be expected to participate in professional development activities that help advance the counseling profession. Successful candidates will be expected to collaborate with colleagues and community partners and assist with, or initiate, new program development. Work hours vary with schedule.

Necessary Qualifications:

- Ph.D. or Ed.D. in Counseling, Counselor Education and Supervision, (or a related educational field, with record of employment as a full-time faculty member in a Counselor Education program for a minimum of one full academic year before July 1, 2013).
- 18 graduate hours in each field in which candidate will teach.
- Experience working with culturally diverse populations.
- Minimum of three-five years of university teaching experience including advising and supervising graduate students.
- Evidence of teaching, service, and professional development potential/productivity, commensurate with rank.
- Record of scholarly activity commensurate with rank.
- Applicants must have a professional identity and work experience grounded in counseling or related educational field.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Graduate of a CACREP accredited program.
- Teaching experience in higher education including advising and supervising graduate students.
- Membership and active participation in professional counseling organizations. Will also have a strong professional identity grounded in counseling or related educational field.
- Three years of work experience in an area commensurate with the academic specialty.
- Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC) and/or Professional School Counselor (PSC) and/or related licensure/certification.
- Capacity to lead or contribute to new program development.
- Experience with CACREP self-study and accreditation process.
