Minimum requirements include evidence of relevant counseling experience to be able to teach practitioners entering school and mental health settings, scholarly production, strong clinical/supervision preparation, and license eligibility in the State of Wyoming. Successful applicants must have an earned doctorate in Counselor Education (CACREP graduate) by the probable start date, Aug. 2020. Preferred qualifications include demonstrated collegiality and ability to work within teams, and experience mentoring master's and doctoral students. Salary will be competitive and commensurate with academic qualifications and experience. The College of Education is strongly committed to attracting active faculty of the highest caliber who will enhance academic and cultural diversity, and are skilled in the scholarship of teaching, discovery, application, and integration of knowledge.
