The University of Florida is currently accepting applications for a **Clinical Assistant Professor of Counselor Education** position.

Successful applicants will demonstrate the ability to provide exceptional teaching and clinical supervision to students in a CACREP-accredited Counselor Education program. Minimum qualifications include a doctorate in counselor education (preferably from a CACREP-accredited program). Candidates should also be either licensed/ certified or eligible as a marriage and family, mental health, or school counselor in Florida.

Preferred experiences and characteristics include experience as an instructor, marriage and family counselor, and in serving diverse populations.

This 12-month faculty appointment will begin August, 2020 (or earlier if negotiated). Salary is negotiable, competitive, and commensurate with qualifications and experience. The Counselor Education program is CACREP accredited and is ranked among the Top 5 in the nation by U.S. News and World Report. The Counselor Education program offers master's and educational specialist degrees in school counseling; mental health counseling; and marriage, couple, and family counseling; and a Ph.D. in counseling and counselor education. The Counselor Education program is housed in the School of Human Development and Organizational Studies in Education (HDSOE) of the College of Education.
